 Workshops are of one of those actions








GRUNDTVIG

Nikolaj Frederik Severin Grundtvig (1783-1872)

- Danish theologian, philosopher, politician and pedagogue
- Founder of the Scandinavian adult education centres
- Coined the idea of lifelong learning for all







Global aims - GRUNDTVIG...

- ...supports learners, teachers and organisations involved in general adult education
- ...offers opportunities for adults to develop their personal abilities and their knowledge
- ...promotes education in our society
- ...sustains mobility and exchange within Europe





Specific targets – GRUNDTVIG aims at...

- ...increasing the mobility of European citizens
- ...supporting people at risk, discriminated or marginalised people in our society
- ...promoting intercultural learning and exchange
- strengthening the cooperation among adult education institutions on a European level
